Library tech master fortifies our infrastructure

In addition to developing new classes, programs and events, we have been working hard behind the scenes to upgrade our technology so that we can better serve our community.

As a recipient of \$1,500 from the Community Foundation for the Alleghenies, we have been able to install new WiFi devices, upgrade desktops and software licensing, and install new and very necessary wiring, at both of our locations (the Dressler Center and the Education & Dance Center.) In 2018, we also started utilizing cloud based storage and converted to a new email system.

This has been a lot of work, and none of this could have been accomplished without the help of Morgan Simmons on behalf of the Mary S. Biesecker Public Library! We are so fortunate to have the library, board and staff as a wealth of knowledge and resources in our community. If you have tech questions, be sure to check out their Tech Tutoring programs, which cover everything from basic computer sessions to an overview of current artificial intelligence devices. We have sent all three of our kids to Studio Kids Preschool. Our 6 and 5 year olds have graduated from your amazing program. This is the second year for our 4-year-old; and he absolutely enjoyed his last year ... We are beyond pleased with their teaching and craft / learning projects and the entire program ... if it wouldn't be for your scholarship program, none of our kids would have had the learning experiences they did and for that my husband and I are truly grateful!

JSO boasts of sell-out concerts

The February concert, Night at the Movies, was a sell-out for the Johnstown Symphony Orchestra. Your next chance to enjoy the an evening with the symphony is March 9, for **Hidden Gems: Orchestral Music of Black Composers**. The music of black composers is too rarely heard in our concert halls, but thanks in part to a new wave of scholarship, more and more is available for performance. Maestro James Blachly has carefully curated this concert of music featuring a "highlight reel" of music from this beautiful, under-performed repertoire. Composers represented in this concert include Jessie Montgomery, Margaret Bonds, William Grant Still, and Florence Price.

The following month, April 13, JSO will explore **Musical Friendships**. Brahms's friendship with Joseph Joachim was one of the most collaborative and productive in the history of music, and Maestro Blachly's long-standing musical friendship with Saint Lawrence String Quartet violinist Owen Dalby goes back many years. To round out this concert featuring musical friendships, the JSO performs Elgar's Enigma Variations, a piece of music composed as a "portrait" of his closest friends. The program will include Brahms Violin Concerto and Elgar Enigma Variations.

The March and April concerts are at 7:30 p.m. at Pasquerilla Performing Arts Center.

The JSO will celebrate its **90th Anniversary** with a concert at 7:30 p.m. May 11 at the recently-renovated Cochran Auditorium. The JSO will perform Gustav Mahler's inspiring Symphony No. 2 "Resurrection" in honor of the 130th anniversary of the Johnstown Flood, and as a rousing call for new life for the great city of Johnstown! The concert will also feature the JSO Chorus and internationally-acclaimed soloists Sarah Brailey and Sara Murphy.

Stained Glass Workshop

String Art Creations

In today's class with instructor Marsha Schmuck you will be guided step by step in creating a string art masterpiece. Students will be contacted before the class to choose one of 3 different projects to complete. Participants will paint the wood and add the nails and their string as part of this workshop.

Pottery Plate Making Workshop

Wednesday, February 27 & Wednesday, March 13, 6-8 pm, Education & Dance Center

This is an adult Pottery Workshop taught by experienced instructor Susan Wilson. Students will learn the techniques involved in creating their very own set of 4 plates created from clay. Susan will show students step by step how to create and decorate the plates using items such as lace, plant parts, stampers, and more. During the second class, students will return to glaze the plates they created in the first class. Wool Braided Rug Making

Session begins Tuesday, March 12, 5:30-6:30 p.m. followed by classes on March 19, 26, April 2 & 9, 5:30-8 p.m.

We are happy to have instructor Lisa Meyers return to Laurel Arts for another one of her beautiful rug making classes. This class teaches a machine free, gadget free, ancient method of making braided rugs. Braided rugs and other homemade rugs are the ultimate recycling projects. Going back to prehistory, mankind has always recycled. These rugs, when cared for properly, become heirlooms. Learn all the techniques and problem-solving skills needed to create a quality rug. Since this is a craft, the skills will be developed in each student according to their needs. The "art" part is in the selection of color combinations.

The first lesson is one-hour or so to go over all the proper materials: needles, thread, thimble, scissors and a lesson on color theory to help you personalize your project. No need to bring anything unless you want to make sure it is correct. Handouts are given with each night's lessons. This is a very important session and cannot be missed. There will be plenty of time for questions. **Please do not buy any materials ahead of this lesson.** After the information session in the first week, students will be responsible for purchasing materials needed for the project. This is not included in the class fee.

You may start a 3' X 5' rug or a 10" X 16" placemat. Either will give you the knowledge and experience to make as many rugs as your heart desires!

Cost for the class is \$75 nonmembers/\$60 members. Fees for materials are not included in the cost. Registration is required. Call Laurel Arts at 443-2433 or text/call 442-6217 to register. Class takes place at the Education & Dance Center, 601 Georgian Place, Somerset.

Plan for a summer of CreARTivity

Summer can be a exhausting time for parents of school-age children. Finding things for them to do while you're at work is tough; finding programs that keep your children active and engaged is even tougher.

Our summer art camps have always been extremely popular, so this year, we decided to give parents the ability to count on us for the entire summer.

You don't have to sign up for every camp; pick the ones that work with your schedule (you can work around vacations, family outings, etc.) We do ask that you register in advance for all the camps you'd like to attend. **SPACE IS LIMITED.**

Each camp will have two instructors. Students will spend the morning session with one instructor, then switch in the afternoon. Specials guests will also visit each week. Students will be placed in groups according to their ages. Camps are appropriate for students in K-6th grade and will also include time for fun, rest and outdoor play.

All camps will run from 9 a.m. to 4 p.m. Monday through Friday. Extended hours before and after camps will be provided as needed for an additional charge. Camps are located at the Education & Dance Center, 601 Georgian Place, Somerset.

Tuition for each camp is \$125 and includes all materials (be prepared ... there will be lots of stuff coming home!) Summer Kickoff (a two-day camp to fill the last week of school) is \$50; and Who's Famous Camp is \$100 (camp won't meet on July 4.) A sibling discount is available (\$15 off for each child after the first.) A multi-camp discount is also offered (10% off after you have attended 3 camps.)

Registration is due no later than two weeks before the start of each camp. If you have pre-registered, tuition is due one week before each camp. To register, call Miss Marsha at 442-6217; a brochure is also available with camp descriptions and registration form.
