For a \$15 donation, participants get to choose a hand-crafted bowl made in our pottery studio by local artists. The bowl is yours to keep and will serve as a reminder that soup feeds the body and ART feeds the soul!

You will also receive a simple, but lovely lunch of soup donated by area restaurants, bread and a beverage.

The event is scheduled from noon to 3 p.m. Saturday, March 16 at the Education & Dance Center, 601 Georgian Place, Somerset, where there is an abundance of parking.

Tickets are available in advance at the Dressler Center and at the door. You are welcome to eat in or take out.

During the Soup-er Bowl Event, there will be a free viewing of ***The One-Hundred Foot Journey*** as part of the *Films on the Town* movie series presented by Laurel Arts, Mary S. Biesecker Public Library, and Somerset, Inc. The movie series is made possible by funding provided by The Community Foundation of the Alleghenies. The film tells the story of a chilly chef proprietress of a restaurant in southern France who gets wind of a culinary immigrant opening an Indian restaurant just 100 feet from her own. Her icy protests escalate to all-out war between the two. The story is a celebration of triumph over exile as these two worlds collide and one young man tries to find the comfort of home in every pot -- wherever he may be.

## Fiber artists come together April 13 to explore *Common Threads*


Laurel Arts and the Somerset Historical Center are partnering for a third year to present to the public a wide variety of historical and contemporary fiber arts techniques and information during a one-day event. This event, entitled **Common Threads**, will take place from 9 a.m. to 4 p.m. Saturday, April 13 in the unique museum space of the Somerset Historical Center, 10649 Somerset Pike, Somerset.

Over a dozen regional fiber artists will be demonstrating specific fiber arts techniques such as basketry, rug weaving, tapestry weaving, tatting, needle felting, embroidery, quilting, knitting, crocheting, spinning, rug hooking, lace-making, printmaking on fabric and much more! Artisans will also be selling their handmade products and providing hands-on activities for participants.

Special presenters include Bonnie Resinski, the "Silhouette Lady," whose one-woman fashion show demonstrates the shapes of modern clothing throughout the 20th century. The other featured presenter is Diane Kelly who is an accomplished fiber artist with a varied and interesting art/design background. She will be speaking about the relationship between Fine Art and Fiber Art.

Common Threads is open to the public. Admission is \$5 per person at the door. There will be a food truck onsite throughout the day. Act 48 credits will be available to teachers who attend.

## Life without music would B<sup>b</sup>

Don't give me credit for the headline ... I merely  it! But, for members of Somerset County Community Band, Laurel Highlands Chorale, the Roof Garden Barbershop Chorus and the Somerset Auxiliary of the Johnstown Symphony Orchestra (all affiliates of Laurel Arts), the sentiment is true.

I have the community band's summer schedule sitting by my computer, and as I look at it, I think, wow ... I know what I'll be doing this summer! My husband plays trumpet with the band and serves as the group's president. I haven't played a band instrument since high school, but I've been a roadie for many, many years (it's my van that we use to haul tympani to various summer concerts.)

So far, there are 16 performances on the band's summer schedule including stops in Bedford, Central City, Hidden Valley, Kingwood, Laurel Hill, Ligonier, Meyersdale, Shanksville, Somerset and Stoystown.

Generally, 30 to 40 musicians show up for each performance; they also practice almost every Thursday evening from mid-March through August. Members range from teens to grandparents of teens (maybe even a few great-grandparents!)

Nearly all band instruments are represented, and new members are always welcome. No auditions, no chairs ... just come as you are and play as you can! What's most important is that you enjoy playing, performing and keeping your brain  (that's sharp, not hashtag!)

First rehearsal of the year will be Thursday, March 21 at Somerset Area Junior High School. Come at 6 p.m. for some pizza and fellowship; rehearsal will start at 7:15 p.m.

If you don't play a band instrument, perhaps you'd like to raise your voice! Laurel Highlands Chorale is in the midst of rehearsals for its annual spring concert to be held at 3:30 p.m. Sunday, May 5 and again at 7 p.m. Monday, May 6 at Somerset Church of the Brethren. Plan to attend, enjoy this musical jamboree, and think about joining in the fall.

Roof Garden Barbershop Chorus is always looking for gentlemen (sorry, ladies) who want to harmonize. The chorus meets at 7 p.m. Tuesdays at Grace United Methodist Church. Members perform throughout the year as a chorus and in quartets at various events throughout the region. They also put on an annual show in the fall. I've had the pleasure of working with these guys on choreography for their show. They are a fun group; they will lift your spirits.

Another affiliate, Somerset Auxiliary of the Johnstown Symphony Orchestra meets at 12:30 p.m. the first Thursday of the month at various locations to plan fundraising events that help to support the JSO. ## **Wool Braided Rug Making**

Session begins Tuesday, March 12, 5:30-6:30 p.m. followed by classes March 19, 26, April 2 & 9, 5:30-8 p.m.

We are happy to have instructor Lisa Meyers return to Laurel Arts for another one of her beautiful rug making classes. This class teaches a machine free, gadget free, ancient method of making braided rugs. Braided rugs and other homemade rugs are the ultimate recycling projects. Going back to prehistory, mankind has always recycled. These rugs, when cared for properly, become heirlooms. Learn all the techniques and problem-solving skills needed to create a quality rug. Since this is a craft, the skills will be developed in each student according to their needs. The "art" part is in the selection of color combinations.

The first lesson is one-hour or so to go over all the proper materials: needles, thread, thimble, scissors and a lesson on color theory to help you personalize your project. No need to bring anything unless you want to make sure it is correct. Handouts are given with each night's lessons. This is a very important session and cannot be missed. There will be plenty of time for questions. **Please do not**

**buy any materials ahead of this lesson.** After the information session in the first week, students will be responsible for purchasing materials needed for the project. This is not included in the class fee.

You may start a 3' X 5' rug or a 10" X 16" placemat. Either will give you the knowledge and experience to make as many rugs as your heart desires!

Cost for the class is \$75 nonmembers/\$60 members. Fees for materials are not included in the cost. Registration is required. Former students are welcome to visit, show off your work or ask a question.
