Festival of Books in uptown Somerset

The second annual Festival of Books in the Alleghenies is coming to Somerset Friday and Saturday, September 20-21.

The event kicks off with the Keynote Author Reception at Somerset Historical Center. Tickets for the event are \$25 and can be purchased at Laurel Arts or online at www.alleghenyregionalfestivalofbooks.org.

Tom McMillan, author of *Flight 93: The Story, The Aftermath and The Legacy of American Courage on 9/11*, is the keynote speaker. McMillan has spent a lifetime in media and communications – as a newspaper sportswriter, columnist, radio talk show host and (for the past 23 years) vice president of communications for the Pittsburgh Penguins of the National Hockey League.

History, however is his passion. He serves on the board of trustees of Pittsburgh's Heinz History Center, on the board of directors of the Friends of Flight 93, on the marketing committee of the Gettysburg Foundation, and as a tour guide at the Civil War room at Carnegie Library. He also is a co-director of the Pittsburgh Center for Sports Media and Marketing at Point Park University, his alma mater.

He has also authored *Gettysburg Rebels*, which won the 2017 Bachelder-Coddington Literary Award as the best new book on the Gettysburg campaign.

Saturday's festivities are all located in uptown Somerset and are free to the public. Come for a full day of fun for the whole family.

Mingle with over 45 authors on East Union Street from 9 am to 4 pm. This year's local and regional authors include award winners and bestsellers, alongside others with their first book in print. Together they cover a huge range of genres—adventure, children's literature, crime, fantasy, historical, mainstream, memoir, middle grade, multi-cultural, mystery, non-fiction, paranormal, romance, sci-fi, suspense, young adult and more.

Several authors will read excerpts at local businesses.

The Festival Main Stage on the Courthouse Steps will host an all-day program featuring live music, poetry, storytelling and the presentations of awards for a writing contest sponsored by The Daily American.

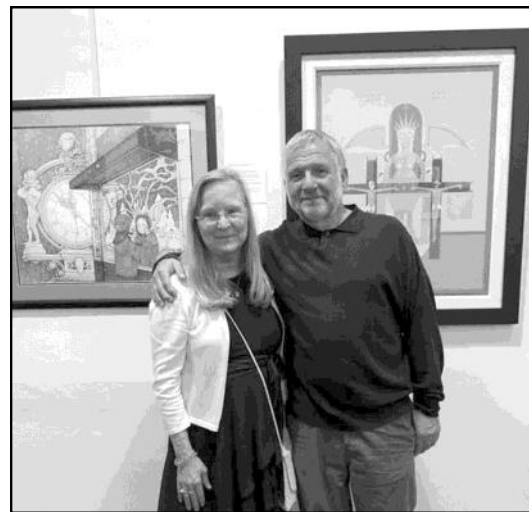

Judy Emerick and William Panos in joint exhibit

Judy L. Emerick, a resident of Somerset County, creates and captures emotion, nuances, and sparks interest in the hearts of many through her studies of the human face, whimsical and narrative illustrations, and eye-catching designs.

Judy, a two-time graduate of the Art Institute of Pittsburgh and artist/owner of Northern Sky Studios applies her visions as a "perpetual student of life and observer of nature" to each piece of her timeless work. Working in several mediums including oils, pastels, pencil, ink, or computer graphics, Judy creates images that draw viewers in and catches their imaginations.



Her use of color and shading are equally compelling. One of her more recent illustrations, *Drawn in Honor*, was featured at a juried exhibit at the Heinz History Center in Pittsburgh. While well-versed in several different styles, her work and study of the art of fine portraiture under nationally-recognized artist, Burton Silverman, has helped her to not only tell stories, but also to defy the parameters of reality and delve creatively into her own imagination. Always exploring new avenues of inspiration, Judy illustrated her first children's book, *Orville: The Bumble Bee Who Didn't Believe He Could Fly*.

William L. Panos began his career as a Graphic Designer with Fisher Scientific Company in Pittsburgh. He later accepted a position as art director with Lando Advertising which merged with Marstellar Advertising. After Marstellar, he worked as a freelance Graphic Designer.

A study of egg tempera painting and Orthodox iconography combined with design and art direction experience initiated a second career in illustration. Based on iconographic methodology, his work is characterized by an emphasis on design and symbolism.

William resides and maintains a studio in southern Somerset County.

Looking ahead to 2030

Jaci McCusker, our Director of Development, asked us (the board) at our recent meeting to consider Laurel Arts' future—what do we envision for Laurel Arts in the year 2030. (Sounds like song lyrics.)

My first thought was, "I can't think that far ahead." My second thought was, "Holy cow, that's only 10½ years from now."

In 2030, Laurel Arts will be 55 years young. Our home, the Dressler Center, on the other hand, will be nearly 200 years old. The Education and Dance Center will just be entering adulthood at 21 years of age (and the dance program will turn 41.)

My hopes for the future of Laurel Arts are:

- to secure our financial future by building our endowment;
- to provide sufficient yearly operating funds by making sure our programs are self-sustaining;
- to be good stewards of our buildings and grounds while making them inviting and intriguing to visitors;
- to preserve and share the arts history of the region by maintaining and expanding our permanent collection;
- to provide arts opportunities and experiences for every child and adult who would like to participate;
- to take our "show on the road" to children and adults who, for whatever reason, can't come to us; and,
- to "demystify" the arts and double (triple or quadruple) the number of people we serve.

I hope we don't change our core mission: *to enhance the quality of life in our community by offering an array of arts and educational opportunities and making them accessible to all.* I do hope we are flexible enough to embrace new ideas in both visual and performance arts.

Understand that I am but one voice; your impressions and ideas are very important to us as we move forward. Feel free to contact any of us (board members and staff are listed on the right.)

Our Annual Meeting will be held at 5:45 p.m. Tuesday, October 8 at the Dressler Center. As members of Laurel Arts, you are invited to attend. At the annual meeting we will elect new board members and present a year-in-review. When that meeting is adjourned, we will have a reorganizational meeting during which we will elect officers for the coming year.

Brooke Sheeler, Senior Grant Associate, Aspire Grant and Development Partners, is your incoming president. She is young, energetic, and full of ideas. I will continue to serve on the board and look forward to ... oh, the places we will go (thank you Dr. Seuss.)

Beginner Mosaics for Hobbyists is a class for those who are interested in learning how to create art by mortaring or gluing pieces of tesserae (material) onto another object or substrate. We will discuss what "mosaics" are and view many different styles and methods of mosaics. Students will be introduced to the classic mosaic hammer and hardie in order to cut local materials such as sandstone, limestone, and coal as well as reclaimed materials such as pottery and glass. Students will also learn to use tile snips as well as glass snips. Students will even be introduced to imported Italian smalti glass that is seen on cathedrals throughout the world. The class will cover how to mix mortar and epoxy, how to build a substrate, and how to apply tesserae in flowing lines of andamento (movement).

Halloween Toile Painting Workshop

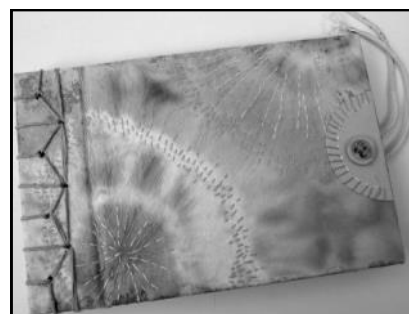
